The winning garden will receive a \$2,500 donation and will be featured in a national publicity campaign highlighting the best gardens in America. The winner and nine finalists will be announced later this summer.

Manito Park's Rose Hill is a favorite location for weddings, picnics and photography. In 2007 Rose Hill was named number one in the nation by All-America Rose Selections. Each year one of the AARS' 125 gardens is selected as the Outstanding Display Garden, and for 2007 the winner was Manito Park's own Rose Hill. All-America Rose Selections is a non-profit association of rose growers and introducers dedicated to the introduction and promotion of exceptional roses. Since 1938 the AARS seal of approval has graced outstanding new rose varieties that have withstood the test of time—and Mother Nature. Rose Hill now is home to over 150 varieties of hybrid tea, grandiflora, floribunda climbers and miniature roses along with a collection of old-fashioned roses. Along with the 2007 award, Rose Hill has received for the past 20-years an Outstanding Maintenance Award, also from AARS.
