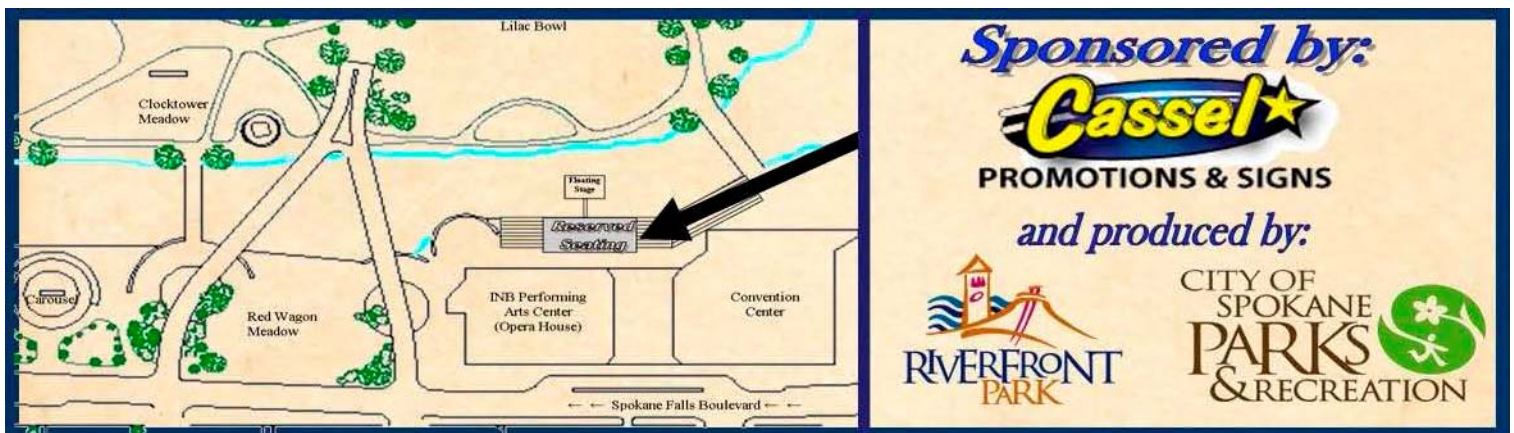

This year the Riverfront Park 4<sup>th</sup> of July Celebration will include a Reserved Seating Area which allows you to reserve your seat.

The seating area is located on the steps adjacent to the floating stage (the south side of the river by the Inland Northwest Performing Arts Center) and a limited

number of reservations are available for patrons with wheel chairs. The seating area opens beginning at 1 pm on July 4, 2010 and will be open for the duration of the event. As a ticket holder, you will be free to come and go as you please!\* You can also show up a few minutes before 10 pm and still experience better than the best seats in town.

Tickets are only \$8.00 per person including a collectable stadium seat cushion – 2 years old and younger are free to sit on the lap of the paid adult. Tickets can be purchased at Riverfront Parks' Guest Services where you can select your seat -or- tickets can be purchased by calling 625-6602 for assigned seats (there will be a \$3.50 handling fee for phone transactions.) Ticket quantities are limited. Call or stop in today so you don't miss out!

### **About Spokane Parks and Recreation**

City of Spokane Parks and Recreation is responsible for the professional management and prudent caretaking of more than 4,100 acres of developed parks and conservation land. The Golf Division maintains and operates four championship municipal golf courses, including Indian Canyon, Downriver, Esmeralda and the Creek at Qualchan. Park Operations has responsibility for the maintenance of all park land and park facilities in the City of Spokane including Riverfront Park, Manito Park, Gaiser Conservatory, the many city-wide gardens, and Finch Arboretum. Urban Forestry staff manages 50,000 street trees and another 28,000 trees on developed park land within the City of

Spokane. The Recreation/Entertainment Division offers classes, special events, athletic leagues and activities for youth, teens, adults, seniors and persons with physical and mental disabilities. It also operates Riverfront Park attractions, activities and events, and provides support for community centers, senior centers, the Northeast Youth Center, Corbin Art Center and outdoor swimming pools.
