CORBIN KIDS FINE ARTS & CRAFTS SUMMER CAMP

Corbin Art Center, a program of the City of Spokane Parks & Recreation Department, hosts the Corbin Kids Summer Camp, a series of weekly fine arts and crafts camps and workshops for children ages 3 – 11; the program begins Monday, June 6, 2011. Pre-registration is required.

The eleven-week program for preschool (ages 3 – 5) and youth (ages 6 – 11) includes one hour, half-day, and all day camps and workshops between 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. The art-based program features a wide range of activities in Art, Crafts, Drama, History, Science, and more. The curriculum incorporates creating, experimentation, and imagination through art and craft projects, games, and outdoor activities. All day camps include supervised lunch. Please bring a lunch. Fees: \$25 to \$110.

Children work with paints, glue, and more so plan to dress accordingly. The Corbin Art Center is conveniently located in the historic Daniel Chase Corbin House located at 507 West Seventh Avenue (the corner of 7th Ave. & Stevens St.). Completed in 1898, the D.C. Corbin House is listed on the local, state, and national historic registers and is situated in the Marycliff/Cliff Park National Register Historic District.
