Edwidge Woldson Park

- Previously known as Pioneer Park, the site has been renamed to honor a generous donor. In September, 2010 the Park Board voted unanimously to honor Edwidge Woldson for her many contributions to Spokane and the Inland Northwest.
- In 2005 Edwidge Woldson's daughter, Miss Myrtle Woldson, honored her mother with a very generous donation to restore the Moore-Turner Heritage Gardens. The restoration work was completed in August, 2007 returning the former residential garden to a time period when it flourished between 1911 and 1914.
- Mrs. Edwidge Woldson, widow of Spokane railroad contractor and capitalist, Martin Woldson was born in Montana, and later moved with her husband to Spokane where they lived for 55 years
