

Craig Butz and Garrett Jones Presented a Powerpoint with 3 Possible Master Plan Alternatives with a Roundtable Discussion

- The Master Plan Project Team reviewed existing park wide inventory and evaluated site conditions
- The Team then determined the pros & cons of the existing site
- The Team determined the spatially-represented existing park amenities and circulation patterns
- The Team created Design Categories or “programming zones”
- Formulated three preliminary conceptual design_ alternatives featuring different traffic-flow patterns and programming-zone locations
- The “programming zones” consist of (1) Connections & Gateways; (2) Entertainment Zones; (3) Commercial Zones; (4) Cultural & Conservation Zones; and (5) Open Space Zones
- Alternative #1 presents centralized entertainment zones in the middle of the park; Alternative #2 presents centralized entertainment zones at the North Bank property; and Alternative #3 presents dispersed entertainment zones throughout the park
- The Team sent out a survey and received 800 responses; approximately 400 were from Stakeholder Organization Members
- Stakeholders requested that the following additional information be presented at the next meeting: (1) seasonal maps showing where people concentrate at during the four different seasons in the park; (2) a baseline analysis that shows where current public parking, gateways, surrounding businesses, current park attractions, vantage points/view corridors and the existing buildings that are in the park; (3) an expanded map to include Huntington Park, the Convention Center, the addition of fingers of the park showing existing urban area south of Spokane Falls Boulevard and Division Street; and (4) the proposed areas for power sources, water sources and restrooms
