Please note the following correct spelling for all facilities, programs and issues related to City of Spokane Parks and Recreation:

Riverfront Park:

Clocktower (one word, capital C)

Pavilion (one lower case "l")

Spokane Falls SkyRide (SkyRide is one word with capital S and capital R)

Carrousel (Looff Carrousel has two oo's, two ff's, two rr's and capital C)

IMAX Theatre (spelling of Theatre is r before e)

Riverfront Rotary Fountain (three words)

Manito Park:

Mirror Pond (historic name reinstated) – no longer "the duck pond"

Moore-Turner Heritage Gardens (hyphen between Moore and Turner, with "s" on Gardens)

Dwight Merkel Sports Complex (not Albi; the Merkel Sports Complex is north of Joe Albi Stadium)

About Spokane Parks and Recreation

City of Spokane Parks and Recreation is responsible for the professional management and prudent caretaking of more than 4,100 acres of developed parks and conservation land. The Golf Division maintains and operates four championship municipal golf courses, including Indian Canyon, Downriver, Esmeralda and the Creek at Qualchan. Park Operations has responsibility for the maintenance of all park land and park facilities in the City of Spokane including Riverfront Park, Manito Park, Gaiser Conservatory, the many citywide gardens and the Finch Arboretum. Urban Forestry staff manage 50,000 street trees and another 28,000 trees on developed park land within the City of Spokane. The Recreation/Entertainment Division offers classes, special events, athletic leagues and activities for youth, teens, adults, seniors and persons with physical and mental disabilities. It also operates Riverfront Park attractions, activities and events, and provides support for community centers, senior centers, the Northeast Youth Center, Corbin Art Center and outdoor swimming pools.
